Performance Summary

Long-Term performance at the Early College, especially in the area of college preparedness, continues to rise. The Early College has become a top performer in the state on standardized assessments. College performance has remained steady throughout the pandemic, though many students have up-to-now chosen to defer taking college courses in hopes of a return to in-person instruction.

High school course progression has suffered, with students passing courses at a rate about 10% lower than during traditional terms. The Early College has taken steps to soften this blow, helping students who were especially close to finishing classes complete those courses this term and not lag behind in progress towards graduation.

Student Performance Reporting & Context

JPEC Course Progression

Fall 2019 - 81% pass rate

Fall 2020 - 72% pass rate

Reflections - Courses taken in the COVID-19 learning environment have a lower pass rate than normal, but JPEC courses are being offered at the same level and rigor as when classes are fully in-person.

Action Steps - <u>Across The Line Program</u>: Dean of Students is working with every student who earned a 2.5 in a class in order to help them complete those classes. Approximately 60 classes. If 100% success, would increase pass rate to 78%

College Performance Monitoring

Overall GPA: 2.98

7-week courses GPA: 3.02

15-week courses GPA: 2.87

Reflections - Pass rates for college classes was fairly consistent with prior terms, hovering around 3.0. Data on 7-week courses is consistent with what the college has found, with a higher GPA. Of note is that college enrollments were down about 50% of normal.

SAT: English - In comparison to statewide 2019 results, 18th highest score in the state. Top 1% of all high schools in the state.

SAT Total Score - In comparison to statewide 2019 results, 62nd highest score in the state. Top 3.5% of all high schools in the state.
